



Winged Sumac Rhus copallinum

A large, deciduous shrub or small tree whose leaves turn reddishpurple in the fall. A winged leaf axis distinguishes this sumac from other species. Makes good ornamental plantings and hedges because of the brilliant red fall foliage. Around 300 bird species include sumac fruit in their diet.
